"Being part of the core team for Sewa Milan ignited a sense of giving back to community, propelling me to engage more deeply with my community. After a period of isolation, I felt an urge to reconnect, and leading Sewa Milan seemed like the perfect opportunity to rekindle that connection and contribute to an influence on the future of the LEAD students. The journey was not without its challenges; the biggest challenge was the planning required for such a significant event. Coordinating multiple stakeholders, accommodating diverse preferences within constraints, and ensuring a seamless execution demanded meticulous effort and effective communication. Fortunately, the dedication of our volunteers and two months of intensive planning made the presentation and emceeing aspects feel like a breeze. Each role was carefully assigned, and everyone was well-prepared to fulfill their responsibilities. However, technical and communication issues posed unexpected challenges during the event. The inability to communicate effectively between the technical room and the stage disrupted the flow of the presentations and transitions, leading to confusion about slide changes and emcee transitions. In response, we improvised on the spot, designating an emcee to manage the technology while not presenting, facilitating smoother transitions, and ensuring timely cues for the lead technician.

Additionally, we leveraged messaging software to coordinate transitions swiftly and calmly, overcoming the communication barrier and maintaining the event's momentum. Reflecting on the entire experience, I learned valuable lessons in teamwork, effective delegation, composure under pressure, and decision-making. SewaMilan provided a platform not only for community engagement but also for personal growth and development. Looking back on this journey, I am grateful for the opportunity to contribute to something meaningful. I am inspired to continue striving for excellence in all endeavors, knowing that challenges are not roadblocks but opportunities for growth and learning." - Aditya Singh
