## Central Jersey Sewa: On-going Service Projects

### **Central Jersey, July 2019** Bench Restoration



One unique project that the Chesterfield SEWA group has taken up is restoring the benches in the community. These 80 benches were in bad condition, dirty and an eyesore. So, the SEWA group decided to fix this problem by sanding and staining the benches. It is very labor-inducing and takes about 6



hours per bench. About 30 Sewa volunteers have been working on this. Sewa has received a lot of praise and applause for their work by the local community and government body.

#### **Beaver Project**

In the Chesterfield community, many trees started being taken down and eaten. This was because of the beavers who had swum upstream and settled in the basin. NJ laws didn't allow for the trapping and

moving of beavers, so it seemed like the only solution was to kill them. The problem was that once the beavers were killed, more would swim upstream and take their spots, creating a cycle of termination. This is where the Sewa group stepped in. With Nancy, the environment commission lead, the chapter set up a beaver management program. The Leads would check the trees that had been chewed, wrap them with a metal fence, and monitor Beaver activities. The program has so far been successful and the number of trees lost has steadily decreased.

#### SHOP GREEN T-Shirt - Workshop

Chesterfield Clean Communities conducted an exclusive workshop for SEWA volunteers on Monday, July 29th at 10 am at the Community Room at the Township Building. At the workshop, we learned how to make the shirts into bags. These bags will be distributed to residents at Annual Harvest Fest on Sept 28th. Sewa volunteers will help create as many bags as possible between now and the end of September.

SEWA will continue with this program throughout the year.


#### Community Garden Volunteering

The Chesterfield Sewa team participated in preparing a community vegetable garden in Bordentown. The team got hands-on experience preparing the garden from scratch. The team worked on raking the ground, spreading compost, covering it with weed fabric, planting vegetables such as Tomatoes, Cucumbers, Beans & covering the area with hay. All the vegetables grown here will be given to the local soup kitchen. The entire project was started by the Deputy Mayor, Eugene Fuzy. After a few weeks, when produce started to grow, Sewa volunteers started picking the vegetables, clearing weeds, and watering plants. 
